First presentation instructions:

- You need to prepare a max. 15 minutes presentation about your research topic, methodology and outcomes. Be aware that you will be interrupted with questions!

- For the seminar to work, you need to do your part of the job. Your responsibilities include:
(1) Work hard on your master thesis and take the presentations seriously -put together a well-prepared set of slides, practice in advance, and make sure you have something well-thought out to say, even if what you are presenting is preliminary.

(2) Participate actively, offer constructive feedback nicely. Talk with your classmates. A lot of the learning that happens comes from talking about projects and ideas with your classmates.

(3) Develop advising relationships with THEMA faculty. Importantly, the seminar is intended to complement, not substitute for, the usual advising process. Your advisor will be your main source of research feedback during the process.

The deadline for handing in your thesis is in **June in on Friday, the 24th at 8:30am**. The thesis must be sent to your supervisor, each member of your Committee as well as to laurence.jacquet@cyu.fr. **The PhD defense will take place between Monday the 27th of June and Tuesday the 5th of July**. The precise date depends on the availabilities of your Committee. The thesis defense consists in 15 minutes presentation followed up by 15 minutes discussion. Students will be required to submit and defend an original research thesis. Students should show the aptitude and the skills of the students to do autonomous research
